



What does 'grassroots' mean, anyway?




Grassroots means coming from, led by, and accountable to the people most impacted by a problem.

Organizational Framework of a grassroots campaign








Early warning is critical to success


If we can detect an issue while it is still in a preliminary phase, then we will have the time to activate the community and design an effective strategy to defeat it.

However, if we detect an issue only after it has moved into final approvals, then we will have much less time and much less chance of success.



Define a Theory of Success

"We will activate a core network of township residents to reject the concept of giving away park property to build a warehouse and retail complex. We will utilize strategic communications to drive turnout to public meetings and demonstrate the consequences of moving forward with the Mayor's agenda."



Form your core team

We formed a core team with the most interested and capable people who were activated to protected the park. This consisted almost 100% of township residents who utilized the park frequently. Everyone on the team had a strong incentive to cooperate and win, no matter the hours dedicated or difficulty of the task. This team was our critical asset.

Egg Harbor City Council plans to take away a large part of our beloved City Lake Park and trade it to a private developer to clear cut trees and build a warehouse adjacent to the Campground and Lake. The City's founders deeded the Lake Park to the City under the single condition that the Park "forever remain public", a promise that has been kept for over 150 years.


The Council wants to remove the deed restriction by designating the park as an "area in need of redevelopment" allowing the park to be privately developed. **This deeply misguided effort** could ruin a resource that has benefited residents for **150** years. Even worse, the developer is employing a former City official who worked on this very issue while serving the town.

The Town should direct the developer to one of the blighted areas in Egg Harbor City along the White Horse Pike or to the unused properties in the Town's Industrial Park. **Residents are against plans to sell off Park property.** If the park is designated as a redevelopment area, there may be no way to stop the further destruction of City Park property or the sell-off of other sections of the lake.


