

immeasurable impact.




An Environmental Commission benefits your Municipality

- ECs are responsible for creating an Environmental Resource Inventory, a guiding document that lists and protects a municipality's environmental features, such as streams, floodplains, trees and open spaces.
- ECs research and acquire funding for environmental projects through grant opportunities and other funding sources available exclusively to ECs.
- ECs save municipalities money on professionals and consultants by drafting ordinances, conducting studies and providing outreach and education via numerous monthly volunteer hours.
- ECs advise land use boards on development proposals to facilitate sound decisions that avoid, or lessen, environmental impacts.

- Prevent localized flooding
- Enhance open space
- Reduce litter and improve recycling programs
