1	<p>is the Sustainable Jersey Climate Vulnerability Assessment Technical Assistance consistent with the Resilience Planning strategy developed by the RNJ</p> <p>The Sustainable Jersey/NJ Future guidance document is focused on development of a climate change-related hazard vulnerability assessment required by the M.L.U.L. The CCR/WRA is not as updated as the methodology implemented through the Resilient NJ projects, but it does reach some conclusions.</p> <p>what is the website</p> <p>Easier to remember - <a href="http://www.sustainablejersey.com">www.sustainablejersey.com</a> will bring you to the same Resilient NJ website.</p> <p>is the Vulnerability Assessment required to be done or only required if there is an amendment to the Land Use Element of the Master Plan after 2021 (as if no amendment there is no requirement to do it)</p> <p>CCR/WRA must be included in any update of a Land Use Plan element adopted after February 4, 2021. However, you are correct that if a municipality does not update their Land Use Plan element, they are not required to perform a CCR/WRA.</p> <p>When will CCR provide a single file with the rest up to date new flood plan.</p> <p>You can access ongoing if the updated information, access on <a href="http://NJFloodResponse.org">NJFloodResponse.org</a>. This is an estimate of the new requirements included in the Flood Protection rules and is reflective of FEMA 1% Chance Annual Flood (100-year) + 3 Feet.
