NJ Shade Tree & Community Forestry Assistance Act (N.J.A.C. 13:1L-17.1 et. seq.)

- Establishes the expanded role of the State's Urban & Community Forestry Program
- Provides the necessary basis for local governments to reduce or eliminate liability associated with local tree care programs and shade tree commissions
- Establishes the NJ Community Forestry Council
- Created the Treasure Our Trees license plate







Urban Tree Benefits

1

Trees capture runoff, lessening the impact of floods

Trees mitigate urban heat island through shade and transpiring leaves.

Shade protects pavement from the sun, increasing road service life

Presence of trees increases property values

Trees filter out pollutants released by combustion engines.

Shoppers are likely to stay in areas with canopy cover.



Urban Tree Liabilities



The creation of a local urban forestry program helps maximize tree benefits while minimizing tree liabilities.



The fruits from trees may create nuisances by remaining on sidewalk and attracting wildlife.



Trees require maintenance such as watering and pruning.



Trees can be hazards: causing damage to property and bodily harm.



Trees can release pollen: the cause of seasonal allergies.


