

SKIP the Stuff: AKA "Accessories Upon Request"

- **Senate Bill 3195** sponsored by Smith & Mukherji; cosponsored by Greenstein, Zwicker, McKeon & Timberlake;
 - Passed out of Senate Environment



- Haider; co-sponsored by Calabrese, Park, Reynolds-Jackson
 - Referred to Assembly Commerce Committee
 - Ordinances enacted in 26 municipalities; resolution in one
 - Model ordinance available
 - Clean Water Action NJ website See RedBank study





SKIP the Stuff - AKA "Accessories Upon Request"

- Single-use cutlery and condiments provided upon request (take-out orders; default no utensils
- Dine-in establishments of 10+ must provide reusable cutlery & condiments
- Utensil dispensers must dispense a single item
- Applies to Schools (5 yr delay), food courts (2 yr delay), stadiums
- Fines: 1st warning; 2nd: \$2.5K; 3rd and subsequent: \$5K
- Fines collected shall go to Clean Communities / Municipality

Packaging and Paper Product Stewardship Act EPR: Extended Producer Responsibility

- Senate Bill 3398 sponsored by Sen. Bob Smith
 - Passed out of Environment & Energy Committee 06/25
- BEYOND PLASTICS NEW JERSEY
- **Assembly Bill A5009** sponsored by .Collazos-Gill, Kennedy, Hall, Haider, Park, Reynolds-Jackson
- Resolutions in support passed in 4 towns; League of Municipalities supports legislation
- Model resolution available





Packaging and Paper Product Stewardship Act EPR: Extended Producer Responsibility

- Mandates packaging reduction by 50% over 10 years.
- Reduces 14 categories of toxins from packaging.
- Saves municipalities and tax payers money from waste hauling (90% of recycling costs)
- Increases recyclability of packaging.
- Addresses environmental injustices
- Eliminates "greenwashing" and loopholes of "chemical recycling".
- Generates new jobs

EPR: What Can EC's do to Help?

Example: Westfield \$720K annual for 2x month recycle pickup

Construction Dust Containment: A Bill is Coming!

Assembly Bill to be introduced this fall - Collazos-Gill & Swift



- Twenty-One (21) municipal ordinances /resolutions passed t
- Gathering interest in other states
- Reduces exposure of microplastics and other waste dust that would otherwise get into our air, waterways and land.
- Requires containment procedures when cutting PVC pipes, manufactured wood, masonry.

Artificial Turf Legislation



Senate Bill 3783 sponsored by Sen. Mukherji & McKnight

- Prohibits municipalities, school districts, and State departments and agencies from purchasing, installing, or using artificial turf.
- Referred to Environment & Energy Committee

Senate Bill SR113 sponsored by Sen Mukherji

- Urges DEP to cease funding synthetic turf field projects and prioritize investing in natural grass playing fields.
- Referred to Environment & Energy Committee

AT Fields: You can Prevent a Green Field!

Present the FACTS to your mayor, town council, school board of ed and school administers

- Bipartisan support- Show them the economic analysis & heat impacts
- Share the Verona Published Study: ATurf Verona Case Study

Pass local ordinances to put a moratorium or full ban on AT

Gas Powered Landscaping Equipment Legislation

S217 sponsored by Sen. Smith

- Prohibits sale and use of gas leaf blowers in NJ
- Tax Credit to commercial providers
- Pending Senate Budget and Appropriations Review

A2319 sponsored by Asw Swain, Asm Calabrese and Asw Hall

- BPU to establish rebate program for purchase of electric or battery operated GLBs
- OLS fiscal estimate completed but costs were indeterminate

Both bills will be filed for a carry over into 2026

Eight (8) municipalities have full or seasonal bans enacted

GLBs: Who Wants less Noise, Air, Soil Pollution?

We need more towns to pass ordinances!

Lead by example: Encourage your town and school district to move to battery-operated landscaping equipment

Educate your residents why gas powered landscaping equipment is a health, environmental, quality of life and social justice issue

Contact elected officials to support proposed statewide legislation
